The training program based on "action learning" will accompany more than 50 Bolivian public sector specialists directly related to NDC implementation in the development of bankable climate programs and projects for the Green Climate Fund (GCF).

The Plurinational Authority of Mother Earth with the support of GIZ initiates a second cycle of the Training and Specialization Program in International Climate Finance for Sectoral Experts: Development of Bankable Climate Projects

The second cycle of the training program "Specialization course in international climate funding for sector experts: development of bankable climate projects" began this April 7, supported by the Plurinational Authority of Mother Earth (APMT) with the technical support of the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) and its PROCUENCA project.

This training aims to provide knowledge and technical tools for design and structuring of programs and climate projects. From there, bringing investments closer to initiatives that aim at sustainable development and compliance with the country's Nationally Determined Contributions (NDC). The

development of bankable project portfolios in the climate field is key to mobilizing public, private and international investments towards resilient and low-emission development of greenhouse gas emissions.

In this way, it is intended that initiatives may be subject to national and international financing and allow the execution of programs and projects that contribute to the fulfillment of the NDC's in all their sectors.

The course will last 20 weeks and is divided into three stages:

- 1. Climate finance architecture:** It will provide the basic knowledge that participants must have for the

online modules. It integrates aspects such as climate agreements and the different sources of international financing.

2. **Capacity building:** Topics such as climate impact chain, climate risk, climate rationality and theory of change, economic visibility, and institutional visibility will be provided.
3. **Advice on developing of project ideas in the concept note format:** Participants will apply the sectoral/managerial and leadership capacities of sectoral/thematic groups to drive the development of bankable climate programs and projects in the GCF concept note format.

The international professor Lic. Jose Luis Ruiz, the APMT and the GIZ will follow the sectoral specialists in the development of their bankable climate proposals.

The learning achieved through the exchange of experiences between sectoral experts from the different ministries will be one of the greatest advantages of this format. We hope that the course will contribute to the development of climate programs and projects and strengthen the dialogue, coordination and sectoral and intersectoral articulation on the NDC, PDES, PSDI and their integration into the PTDI to achieve the country's climate change objectives.
